

March Meeting

The March 29th QCWA meeting at the Denny's in North Syracuse was attended by 29 members and guests, who were treated to an excellent presentation by Steve Auyer N2TKX about his restoration of a 1940 GE JB-520 farm radio. Steve's well-illustrated power point series ran on the LCD TV in our dining area, and he distributed a 45 page handout to all present. Starting with the history behind the need for "farm radios" in the era before rural electrification was completed (the late '20's through the early '50's), Steve then discussed

the radio power sources available to rural listeners of that era; wet cell and dry batteries, wind generators, and small gas powered electric plants among them. Steve's careful radio restoration process included cabinet refinishing, replacement of defective or suspicious parts and deteriorated wiring, and careful alignment. Steve opted to purchase a universal radio battery replacement kit from Antique Electronic Supply and adapt it for his specific needs. Extra handouts are available for those who missed this meeting.
