There have been some big changes to the QCWA with the beginning of the New Year. The Journal with the last two issues printed in newspaper style has found no resonance. It is well worth your while. You qualify for all the awards. QCWA attends major hamfests and represents you in amateur matters. There is a yearly convention and often combined with a cruise, where they have one or more Hamstations installed. You can also sign up to a bulletin board, which is usually quiet but very handy if you have something to announce or if you have a question like what your friends address was in 1953 when you remember the call but not much else.
